
What we wanted to find out from the community survey:

- Ways the NPD could improve relations with the community


## **Survey Process & Methodology**

  - Survey conducted in English, Spanish, and Portuguese









## Do you have positive, neutral or negative feelings towards the police officers who work in your neighborhood?


















#### On a scale of 0 to 3, how much do you trust the NPD?









#### If you witnessed a crime or knew about a crime (before or after it took place), would you report it?

  if I was a victim.


#### Depends:

 Depends. Not a snitch. See a pregnant woman, I'm gonna say something; drug dealers don't say nuthin'.


#### No, I would not:

- Some things can be handled by adults.


## As a victim of a crime did you call the police or file a report? Why or why not? (Would you call police or file report if you became a victim? Why or why not?)






#### What type of contact did you have with the NPD? Choose all that apply.




#### What type of contact did you have with the NPD? Choose all that apply. (by Gender)




#### What type of contact did you have with the NPD? Choose all that apply. (by Ethnicity)


#### Positive

- The officer treated me with respect.


#### Negative

- No, I don't speak English, he ripped my international drivers license.




#### What could the NPD do to improve community relations in your neighborhood?




## What could the NPD do to improve community relations in your neighborhood? (by Ward)




### What could the NPD do to improve community relations in your neighborhood? (by Ethnicity)






#### No Problems/Police Doing Well:

- None, really I think they are trying their best at what they do. They're not perfect and their damn sure ain't God. So we can't expect perfection from them.


#### Profiling/Racism/Harassment:

- We all human first and we need to be respected. Approach the people like people and not like animals.







### What issues, if any, would you like the NPD to focus on in your neighborhood? (by Ward)




The City reported 107 murders in 2006, 99 in 2007, 67 in 2008, and 77 in 2009. How do you feel about that?

## **Key Findings**

- More positive and neutral feelings towards NPD than negative
- East Ward (Hispanic community) has overall more positive feelings towards NPD
- Gangs/drugs/youth are a major issue in all wards and among all ethnicities.
- Police demeanor and attitude towards residents are a concern among all ethnicities and wards.
- African-Americans (particularly males) experiencing a lot of involuntary contact with the NPD
- Racism/cultural sensitivity concerns especially among Hispanic/Latino community
  - A lot of that has to do with language barrier
  - Issue of officers asking for documentation and/or undocumented immigrants not seeking help out of a fear that officers' will ask for documentation.
- North and East Wards: Community Relations is major issue; want more visibility and want
   NPD to hold/attend more community meetings and activities
- West and South Wards: Want more positive contact with the NPD
- Those that are feeling safer are doing so because of increased police presence
- Those that are feeling less safe are doing so because of violence/crime/gangs
- Response time and follow-up is a concern, especially when calling 911
- Anti-snitching culture is preventing some residents from reporting crimes
- Positive interactions lead to positive feelings towards the NPD
- Positive feelings makes it more likely that residents will trust the NPD and will report crimes

### Recommendations

- To combat response time issues:
  - 1. Analysis Being Conducted on Calls analyzing ways to use resources better.
  - 2. Call back
  - 3. Report Cars
- Attend/hold more community meetings and activities; more positive community interactions.
  - Each precinct has scheduled one day per month community meetings at Command
  - Currently four community service officers (one for each precinct)
- Overall issue of attitude and demeanor needs to be addressed through training
  - Recommendations addressed by Training subcommittee and Police conduct subcommittee
- Anti-anti-snitching marketing campaign
- Convey survey results to all NPD employees (all positive and negative results and quotes)
